SUNDAY REFLECTION

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading, 1 Kings 19: 16b, 19-21

Elijah anoints Elisha as his successor.

Psalm 16

Set the Lord ever before me

Second Reading, Galatians 5: 1, 13-18

Christ has set us free.

Gospel, Luke 9: 51-52

Jesus is resolutely determined to journey to Jerusalem.

Three small stories of call illustrate the demands Jesus makes of his followers. In each case response requires renunciation. We must not base our faith on the material or psychological securities we have erected to protect ourselves from the furies of winter or vicissitudes of the soul. Nor can we put our assurance in a dead past. We would run the risk of perishing with it. We must keep our eyes on the road ahead, refusing to enter the future backwards. One image summarizes all this: the road along which Jesus calls his disciples to follow him. We must walk in the present, or better, in the presence of Jesus. Then we can discover life because we are led by the Spirit.

Am I prepared to make my journey to Jerusalem? Is fidelity to the gospel the first priority in my life?

We pray for perseverance amid trials and hardships. We pray for those who have no time for the good news.
